

UNESCO Recognition: Bosnia's traditional love song, Sevdalinka, often referred to as the Balkan Blues, was recognized by UNESCO and included in its National Inventory of Intangible Cultural Heritage on December 27, 2024.


Historical Significance: Sevdalinka dates back to the **16th century** and is a blend of South Slavic oral poetry and Ottoman Empire music.

Pt. Swapan Choudhary Receives National Tansen Award 2023 20/12/2024

The National Tansen Award and Raja Mansingh Tomar Award were given on **18 December 2024** during the **Tansen Festival** in Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh.

National Tansen Award:

Recipient: Pt. Swapan Choudhary, a renowned tabla player from Kolkata, was honored with the National Tansen Samman for the year 2023.

Prize: The award includes an **honorarium of five lakh rupees**, a **citation plaque**, and a **shawl-shriphal**.

Significance: This award is the highest national music award in the field of Indian classical music, established by the Madhya Pradesh government.

Raja Mansingh Tomar Award:

Recipient: Sanand Nyas, an institution from Indore, was honored with the **Raja Mansingh Tomar Samman** for the year **2023**.

Institution's Contribution: Sanand Nyas has been active in the fields of classical music, drama, and cultural festivals in Indore for the last 35 years.



Gadhimai Mahotsav: World's Largest Animal Sacrifice Festival 17/12/2024

The Gadhimai Mahotsav, held every five years at the Gadhimai Temple in Nepal's Madhesh Province, is the world's largest animal sacrifice festival. Gadhimai Mahotsav, started on December 2 and concluded on December 15, 2024. Despite decades of criticism from animal rights activists and court bans in India and Nepal, the 2023-24 festival saw a record footfall of 2.5 crore people. The festival's central rituals involve sacrificing animals like buffaloes, goats, and birds, preceded by a shamanic offering of five forest animals. Devotees believe the sacrifices fulfill wishes, often related to patriarchal traditions, such as blessings for male offspring.

Efforts to curb the practice have included court rulings restricting animal transport and banning public sacrifices, but enforcement is weak, and sacrifices now occur behind closed doors. Meat from sacrificed animals is auctioned and often exported, adding economic value. The festival generates significant revenue through tourism and local commerce, creating a financial incentive for its continuation. Political reluctance to intervene stems from the fear of offending religious sentiments, leaving NGOs and civil society groups struggling to balance opposition with respect for cultural traditions.



Legendary tabla maestro Zakir Hussain passed away at the age of 73 in the United States 16/12/2024

Legendary tabla maestro **Zakir Hussain** passed away at the age of **73** in the **United States** on **15 December 2024** due to bloodpressure-related complications. Born on **March 9, 1951**, in **Mumbai**, he was the eldest son of tabla legend **Allah Rakha**.

With a career spanning six decades, Zakir Hussain won five Grammy Awards, including three at the 66th Grammy Awards in 2024. He acted in films such as 'Saaz' and 'Heat and Dust', with his latest film 'Monkey Man' released in 2024. His groundbreaking 1973 collaboration with John McLaughlin, L Shankar, and T.H. 'Vikku' Vinayakram fused Indian classical music with jazz, creating a new genre.

Zakir Hussain received numerous prestigious honors, including the **Padma Shri** in 1988, the **Padma Bhushan** in 2002, and the **Padma Vibhushan** in 2023.



Hornbill Festival in Kisama Heritage Village, Nagaland from December 1 to December 10. 06/12/2024

The Hornbill Festival, also known as the Festival of Festivals, is an annual celebration held in the northeastern Indian state of Nagaland from December 1 to December 10. Organized by the Government of Nagaland, the festival showcases the rich cultural heritage of the Naga tribes and aims to promote inter-ethnic interaction and unity.

The festival takes place at the **Kisama Heritage Village**, located about 12 km from Kohima. It features a vibrant array of cultural displays, including traditional Naga dances, music, crafts, sports, food fairs, and religious ceremonies. Visitors can experience the unique customs, folklore, and traditions of the Naga people, making it a truly immersive cultural experience.

Key highlights of the Hornbill Festival include:

Traditional Naga Morungs: Exhibitions showcasing the traditional houses and cultural artifacts of the Naga tribes.

Cultural Performances: Colorful dances, songs, and music performances by various Naga tribes.

Crafts and Art: Display and sale of traditional Naga crafts, wood carvings, paintings, and sculptures.

Food Fairs: A variety of Naga cuisine, including traditional dishes and delicacies.

Sports and Games: Traditional Naga sports such as archery, wrestling, and indigenous games.

Music Festival: The Hornbill Music Festival, featuring performances by renowned artists from across India and abroad.

The Hornbill Festival is a celebration of Naga culture and heritage, providing a platform for the diverse ethnic groups of Nagaland to come together and share their traditions with visitors from around the world.



Mandapam, New Delhi, from 6 to 8 December 2024 06/12/2024

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate the Ashtalakshmi Mahotsav at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi, on 6 December 2024. The three-day festival celebrates the culture, crafts, and tourism of the eight North Eastern states—Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim, and Tripura—collectively known as Ashtalakshmi.

The event will feature:

250+ artisans showcasing handicrafts, handlooms, and agri-horti products, including **34 GI-tagged items**.

A Fashion Show, Design Conclave, and Buyer-Seller Meet to promote collaborations and economic growth.

A Rural Haat Bazaar with products from 320 farmers and artisans.

The Mahotsav aims to boost economic development in the North East, creating opportunities for artisans, weavers, and entrepreneurs.



Maha Kumbh 2025 in Prayagraj from January 13 to February 26, 2025 04/12/2024

The Maha Kumbh 2025 is set to be a grand and spiritually significant event, taking place in Prayagraj, Uttar Pradesh from January 13 to February 26, 2025. This festival, held once every 12 years, is one of the largest religious gatherings in the world, attracting millions of devotees and tourists from across the globe.

The Maha Kumbh is rooted in Hindu mythology and is celebrated at four sacred locations: Prayagraj, Haridwar, Ujjain, and Nashik. The event commemorates the mythological churning of the ocean (Samudra Manthan) and the subsequent quest for the nectar of immortality. Pilgrims believe that taking a dip in the holy waters during the Kumbh Mela cleanses them of their sins and brings them closer to salvation.

Key highlights of the Maha Kumbh 2025 include:

Royal Baths (Shahi Snan): These are special bathing dates when religious leaders and devotees take a dip in the holy waters. Important dates include Makar Sankranti (January 14), Mauni Amavasya (January 29), Basant Panchami (February 3), Maghi Purnima (February 12), and Mahashivratri (February 26).

Cultural Events: The festival features vibrant cultural activities such as traditional

processions (Peshwai), spiritual discourses, yoga sessions, and devotional music performances.

Infrastructure and Facilities: The Uttar Pradesh government has made extensive preparations, including the creation of a new district for the duration of the Maha Kumbh, improved infrastructure, and world-class accommodation facilities.

AWARDS AND HONORS



President Murmu Awards Pradhan Mantri Rashtriya Bal Puraskar to 17 Exceptional Children 27/12/2024

President Droupadi Murmu conferred the **Pradhan Mantri Rashtriya Bal Puraskar** on **17 children** in New Delhi on **26 December 2024**.

Categories: The children were recognized for their achievements in Art and Culture, Bravery, Innovation, Science and Technology, Social Service, Sports, and Environment.

Awards: Each awardee received a medal, a certificate, and a citation booklet.

States and UTs: The awardees hailed from 14 states and union territories.

Veer Bal Diwas Tribute: President Murmu paid homage to the bravery and sacrifice of the Sahibzadas on Veer Bal Diwas, honoring the younger sons of the tenth Sikh Guru, Guru Gobind Singh. **Prime Minister's Interaction**: Prime Minister Narendra Modi interacted with the awardees.



PM Modi Honoured with Kuwait's Highest Civilian Award, "The Order of Mubarak Al Kabeer" 23/12/2024

Prime Minister Narendra Modi was awarded Kuwait's highest civilian honor, The Order of Mubarak Al Kabeer, by Sheikh Meshal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al Sabah, the Amir of Kuwait, during his state visit on 22nd December 2024.

Significance: The award symbolizes the enduring partnership between **India** and **Kuwait**.

Bilateral Talks: PM Modi held talks with the Amir, focusing on strengthening **India-Kuwait relations**, which have now been elevated to a **Strategic Partnership**.

Historical Context: This is the **first visit** by an Indian Prime Minister to Kuwait in **43 years**.



Easterine Kire Wins Sahitya Akademi Award 2024 for 'Spirit Nights' in English Category 20/12/2024

Easterine Kire: Noted author from Nagaland, Easterine Kire, has been selected for

the Sahitya Akademi Award 2024 in the English language category.

Award for Spirit Nights: Kire's novel, Spirit Nights, published by Simon and Schuster India, won the award in the English language category. The novel is inspired by a story from the Chang Naga tribe of Nagaland.

Annual Sahitya Akademi Awards: The awards were announced in **21 languages** on 18 December 2024.

Other Awardees from the North East:

Sameer Tanti: Awarded for Pharingbore Bator Katha Jane in the Assamese language.

Haobam Satyabati Devi: Awarded for Mainu Bora Nungshi Sheirol in the Manipuri language under the Poetry category.

Aron Raja: Awarded for Swrni Thakhai in the Bodo language under the Novel category.

Award Ceremony: The awardees will receive a casket containing an engraved copper plaque, a shawl, and a cash prize of one lakh rupees. The ceremony will be held on 8th March 2025 in Delhi.



Hindi writer Suryabala awarded the 34th Vyas Samman 2024 for novel Kaun Des Ko Vasi: Venu Ki Diary 13/12/2024

Noted Hindi writer Suryabala has been awarded the 34th **Vyas Samman 2024** for her novel *Kaun Des Ko Vasi: Venu Ki Diary*,

published in 2018. The award, instituted by the KK Birla Foundation in 1991, honors outstanding Hindi literary works published in the last 10 years. It includes a ₹4 lakh cash prize, a citation, and a plaque. The selection was made by a committee chaired by eminent litterateur Prof. Ramji Tiwari.

Suryabala, born in Varanasi in 1943, holds an MA and a PhD in Hindi literature from Kashi Vishwavidyalaya. Over her decades-long career, she has written over 50 books, including novels, biographies, and children's literature, with many adapted into TV serials. Her works often focus on social issues.

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Kaun Des Ko Vasi: Venu Ki Diary explores the struggles of Indian youth migrating to America, addressing cultural conflicts, spiritual alienation, and disconnection from their roots. The novel is an authentic reflection of the challenges faced by overseas Indians, blending personal experiences and cultural insights.



President Droupadi Murmu Presents National Panchayat Awards 2024 12/12/2024

On December 11, 2024, the President of India, Smt. Droupadi Murmu, presented the National Panchayat Awards 2024 at Vigyan Bhawan in New Delhi. The event honored 45 exceptional Panchayats for their outstanding contributions to sustainable and inclusive development in rural India.

The awards recognized the efforts of these Panchayats in areas such as poverty alleviation, health, water conservation, sanitation, and climate sustainability. The President emphasized the importance of village development and empowerment in making India a developed nation. She congratulated the winners and expressed confidence that this recognition would inspire other Panchayats to adopt best practices for inclusive growth.

The National Panchayat Awards, revamped in 2022 to align with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), celebrated the role of Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs) in driving grassroots development. The awards were presented across various categories, including the Deen Dayal Upadhyay Panchayat Satat Vikas Puraskar and the Nanaji Deshmukh Sarvottam Panchayat Satat Vikas Puraskar.

The event was attended by Union Minister of Panchayati Raj, Shri Rajiv Ranjan Singh alias Lalan Singh, and other dignitaries. A booklet titled "Best Practices on Works of Awardee Panchayats" was also unveiled, documenting the innovative practices implemented by the award-winning Panchayats.



Payal Kapadia: First Indian Nominee for Best Director at Golden Globes Awards 10/12/2024

Filmmaker **Payal Kapadia** has made history as the first Indian director nominated for **Best Director (Motion Picture)** at the **82nd Golden Globe Awards** for her film *All We Imagine As Light*. The film has also been nominated

for Best Motion Picture – (Non-English Language).

An Indo-French co-production, the film stars Kani Kusruti, Divya Prabha, and Hridhu Haroon, portraying the struggles of two women during a transformative trip to a beach town. It previously won the Grand Prix at the Cannes Film Festival, becoming the first Indian film in the competition section in 30 years.

The film has also earned accolades like **Best** International Film at the New York Film Critics Circle and Best International Feature at the Gotham Awards 2024.

The Golden Globe nominees for Best Director include renowned filmmakers like Jacques Audiard (*Emilia Perez*) and Sean Baker (*Anora*). The 82nd Golden Globe Awards will be held on **January 6, 2025**.



Saule Biluvaite's Film 'Toxic' Wins Golden Peacock Award at 55th IFFI 2024 29/11/2024

The closing ceremony of 55th International Film Festival of India (IFFI) 2024, was held on 28 November in Panaji, Goa. Saule Biluvaite's *Toxic* won the prestigious Golden Peacock Award, receiving a ₹40 lakh cash prize, a trophy, and a certificate.

Clement Faveau won Best Actor Male, while Vesta Matulyte and Leva Repuikaite shared the Best Actor Female award for their performances in *Toxic*. In the Indian section, Navjot Bandiwadekar was honored as Best Debut Director for *Gharat Ganpati*, and *Lampan* received the Best Web Series OTT award. Vikrant Massey was celebrated as the Indian Film Personality of the Year.

The ceremony featured cultural performances by Mame Khan and Amaal Malik and was attended by dignitaries like Goa CM Dr. Pramod Sawant, I&B Secretary Sanjay Jaju, and Bollywood icons such as Madhur Bhandarkar, Rashmika Mandanna, and Jayaprada.

ECONOMY



India becomes 3rd largest exporter of smartphones globally 18/12/2024

India has become the **3rd largest exporter of smartphones globally**, climbing from the 23rd rank in 2019. In November 2024, the country's smartphone exports surpassed **₹20,000 crore** in a single month, representing a **92% increase** compared to November 2023 (₹10,634 crore).

This milestone exceeds the expectations set under the **Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme**, which aimed to export 70-75% of production value in FY 2024-25. Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw celebrated this achievement, calling it a "Making Bharat Story."



Sanjay Malhotra appointed new Governor of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) 10/12/2024

Sanjay Malhotra, the current Revenue Secretary at the Ministry of Finance, has been appointed as the new Governor of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). His tenure will begin on December 11, 2024, and last for three years.

A 1990-batch IAS officer from the Rajasthan cadre, Malhotra is an Engineering graduate from IIT Kanpur and holds a Master's degree in Public Policy from Princeton University. He has held various key positions across sectors such as finance, taxation, power, information technology, and mines. As Revenue Secretary, he has been pivotal in formulating tax policies.

Malhotra succeeds Shaktikanta Das, who has completed a successful six-year term as the RBI Governor. Das, recognized for his leadership during critical times, will conclude his term on December 10, 2024.



RBI keeps repo rate unchanged; Cuts Cash Reserve Ratio by 50 basis points to 4%; 07/12/2024

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI), in its December monetary policy meeting, decided by a 4:2 majority to keep the policy repo rate unchanged at 6.50% for the 11th consecutive time since February 2023. The SDF rate remains at 6.25%, and the MSF rate and Bank Rate at 6.75%. The RBI also reduced the Cash Reserve Ratio (CRR) by 50 basis points to 4%, releasing ₹1.16 lakh crore to ease liquidity stress.

RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das emphasized the commitment to price stability amid inflationary pressures and revised the FY25 inflation forecast to 4.8% from 4.5%. The MPC retained its neutral stance, focusing on aligning inflation with the target while supporting growth. The policy meeting was held on December 4-6, 2024.



RBI Raises UPI Lite Wallet Limit to ₹5,000 and Offline Transaction Limit to ₹1,000 06/12/2024

On **4 December 2024**, the **Reserve Bank of India (RBI)** increased the **UPI Lite wallet limit** from ₹2,000 to ₹5,000 and raised the **offline transaction limit** from ₹500 to ₹1,000 per transaction. These changes are effective immediately, aiming to enhance convenience and security for digital payments.

Under the new guidelines, UPI Lite allows transactions of up to ₹1,000 per payment, with a total wallet cap of ₹5,000. Previously, the offline framework permitted a maximum of ₹500 per transaction and a wallet limit of ₹2,000. This update aligns with the RBI's efforts to promote **digital transactions** and provide a more inclusive payment experience.

The changes are implemented under **Sections 18 and 10(2) of the Payment and Settlement Systems Act, 2007**. The announcement builds on an earlier update by RBI Governor **Shaktikanta Das** in October 2024, highlighting the growing significance of UPI in India's economy.

In October 2024, UPI achieved a recordbreaking **16.58 billion financial transactions in a single month**, reflecting its pivotal role in revolutionizing India's payment ecosystem since its launch in 2016 by the **National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI)**.

GOVERNMENT SCHEMES



Bharatmala Project: A Roadmap to Efficient Connectivity 14/12/2024

The **Bharatmala Project** (Pariyojana), launched in **2015**, is a large-scale infrastructure initiative by the Indian government aiming to enhance the efficiency of freight and passenger movement. The project focuses on developing a comprehensive network of highways, aiming to connect **550 district headquarters** with 4lane highways and move **80% of freight traffic** to National Highways.

Key components include the development of economic corridors, inter-corridors and feeder routes, and greenfield expressways. The project also emphasizes border and international connectivity roads, coastal and port connectivity, and national corridor efficiency improvement.

Implementation involves the creation of **multimodal logistics parks**, the use of **technology and scientific planning**, and a phased approach, with the first phase expected to be completed by **2022**. The project aims to generate significant employment opportunities, improve regional connectivity, and boost economic growth, aligning with initiatives such as **Make in India** and **Digital India**.

IMPORTANT DAYS



Veer Baal Diwas, December 26: Commemorating Sacrifice and Celebrating Youth Achievements 26/12/2024

Veer Baal Diwas is observed annually on **December 26**.

Purpose: The day honors the bravery and sacrifice of Guru Gobind Singh Ji's younger sons, Baba Zorawar Singh and Baba Fateh Singh.

Historical Significance: In 1704, the Sahibzadas were captured and pressured to renounce their Sikh faith. They refused and were martyred by being bricked alive at Sirhind, Punjab.

Declaration: Prime Minister Narendra Modi declared December 26 as Veer Baal Diwas in **2022** to commemorate their sacrifice.

2024 Celebrations: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will address the event at **Bharat**

Mandapam, New Delhi, and launch the Suposhit Gram Panchayat Abhiyan to enhance nutritional outcomes across India.

Pradhan Mantri Rashtriya Bal Puraskar: President Droupadi Murmu will confer the award on **17 children** for exceptional achievements in **seven categories** in New Delhi. The children hail from **14 states and UTs**.

Categories: Art and culture, bravery, innovation, science and technology, social service, sports, and the environment.

Awards: Each awardee will receive a medal, certificate, and citation booklet.



Good Governance Day on December 25th 25/12/2024

Good Governance Day is observed annually on **December 25th** in India to honor the birth anniversary of former Prime Minister **Atal Bihari Vajpayee**. Instituted in 2014 by the Narendra Modi government, this day aims to promote **transparency**, **accountability**, **and efficiency** in public administration.

Significance

Good Governance Day highlights the importance of ethical leadership and responsible governance. It serves as a reminder for both leaders and citizens to uphold high standards of governance to ensure sustainable development and public welfare.


Human Rights Day is observed annually on December 10th

Human Rights Day is observed annually on December 10th to commemorate the adoption of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) by the United Nations General Assembly in 1948. This day serves as a reminder of the fundamental rights and freedoms that every individual is entitled to, regardless of nationality, race, gender, religion, or any other status.

The UDHR, a landmark document in human rights history, outlines a broad range of rights and freedoms that form the foundation of international human rights standards. It includes rights such as the right to life, liberty, and security of person; freedom from torture and slavery; the right to a fair trial; freedom of thought, conscience, and religion; and the right to education, among others.

Human Rights Day is a day to reflect on the progress made in upholding these rights and to recognize the ongoing challenges that still exist.



Navy Day 2024: December 4th 04/12/2024

Navy Day 2024 is celebrated on December 4th to honor the bravery and commitment of naval forces. This year, the event will be held in Puri, Odisha, with President Droupadi Murmu as the chief guest.

The day commemorates the success of **Operation Trident**, a significant naval mission during the 1971 Indo-Pak war. On December 4, 1971, the Indian Navy launched a surprise attack on Karachi, crippling Pakistan's key port and asserting India's naval prowess.



International Day of Persons with Disabilities (IDPD): December 3rd 04/12/2024

The International Day of Persons with Disabilities (IDPD) is observed annually on December 3rd to promote the rights and well-being of persons with disabilities in all spheres of society and development. This day aims to raise awareness about the challenges faced by individuals with disabilities and to advocate for their full and equal participation in social, economic, political, and cultural life.

Established by the United Nations in 1992, IDPD focuses on various themes each year, addressing different aspects of disability inclusion. The themes often highlight issues such as accessibility, inclusion, employment, education, and empowerment of people with disabilities.

Key objectives of IDPD include:

Raising Awareness: Highlighting the barriers that people with disabilities face and promoting solutions to overcome them.

Promoting Rights: Advocating for the rights of persons with disabilities as enshrined in international law, such as the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD).

Encouraging Inclusion: Promoting the inclusion of persons with disabilities in all areas of life, including education, employment, and community activities.

Celebrating Achievements: Recognizing the contributions and achievements of people with disabilities in various fields.

Border Security Force (BSF) Raising Day: December 1 02/12/2024

The **Border Security Force (BSF)** celebrated its **60th Raising Day** on **December 1, 2024**. This day marks the anniversary of the force's formation in 1965.

History and Facts about the BSF

Formation: The BSF was established on **December 1, 1965**, in the wake of the Indo-Pakistani War of 1965. The need for a specialized force to guard India's borders became evident after Pakistan attacked Sardar Post, Char Bet, and Beria Bet in Kutch.

First Director General: K F Rustamji, an Indian Police Service (IPS) officer, was the first Director General and founding father of the BSF.

Motto: The BSF's motto is "Jeevan Paryant Kartavya", which translates to "Duty Unto Death".

Role: The BSF is responsible for guarding India's land borders with Pakistan and Bangladesh. It is the world's largest border security force, with a sanctioned strength of **270,000 personnel**.

Capabilities: The BSF has grown from 25 battalions in 1965 to **193 battalions** today, including an air wing, water wing, artillery regiment, and specialized units.

Operations: Apart from border guarding, the BSF also engages in counter-insurgency operations, anti-Naxal operations, and internal security duties. They have been involved in various operations, including the Indo-Pakistani War of 1971 and the Kargil War.

Azerbaijan Airline Crash in Kazakhstan 28/12/2024

On December 25, 2024, an Azerbaijan Airlines flight, **J2-8243**, crashed near Aktau, Kazakhstan, resulting in the tragic loss of **38 lives** and leaving **29 survivors**. The Embraer 190 aircraft was en route from Baku, Azerbaijan, to Grozny, Russia, when it encountered severe turbulence and loud bangs, leading to a catastrophic crash.


Key Details:

Flight Path: The plane was diverted from its original route due to heavy fog in Grozny and attempted an emergency landing in Aktau.

Survivor Accounts: Passengers reported hearing multiple loud bangs and experiencing a loss of cabin pressure before the crash.

Investigation: Authorities from Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan, and Russia have launched investigations to determine the cause of the crash. Initial speculations suggest possible **external interference**, with some sources indicating that Russian air defenses might have mistakenly shot down the aircraft.

Casualties: The crash claimed 38 lives, including both pilots, and left many survivors with serious injuries.



<u>China Approves World's Largest Dam on</u> <u>the Brahmaputra River</u> 28/12/2024

China has recently approved the construction of the world's largest dam on the Brahmaputra River, located in Tibet near the Indian border. This ambitious project, estimated to cost around \$137 billion, has raised significant concerns in India and Bangladesh.

Key Details:

Location: The dam will be built at a significant gorge in the Himalayan reaches where the Brahmaputra River makes a U-turn before flowing into Arunachal Pradesh and subsequently into Bangladesh.

Scale: The project is expected to exceed one trillion yuan (\$137 billion), surpassing even China's Three Gorges Dam, currently the world's largest.

Purpose: The primary aim is to develop clean energy and respond to climate change and extreme hydrological disasters. The hydropower facility is estimated to generate over 300 billion kWh of electricity annually, enough to supply energy to approximately 300 million people for a year.

Concerns: India and Bangladesh have expressed apprehensions about potential impacts on water flow and regional stability. There are fears that China could control the water flow and release large amounts of water during conflicts.

Safety Measures: China has assured that extensive geological studies and advanced technology have been employed to ensure the project's safety and minimize ecological impact. The dam will also incorporate measures for disaster prevention and relief.

International Reactions:

India's Response: India has raised concerns about the potential impact on water flow and the ability of China to control water during hostilities. India is also constructing its own dam on the Brahmaputra in Arunachal Pradesh.

China's Assurance: Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Mao Ning has stated that the project will not negatively affect the lower reaches and that China will continue to maintain communication with countries at the lower reaches through existing channels.



Kristrun Frostadottir Becomes Iceland's Youngest Prime Minister 24/12/2024

Iceland's new government, led by Prime Minister **Kristrun Frostadottir** of the Social Democratic Alliance (SDA), took office on **21 December 2024**.

Youngest Prime Minister: Frostadottir, born in 1988, is Iceland's youngest prime minister. She was elected to parliament in 2021 and became SDA leader in 2022.

Three-Party Coalition: The coalition includes the SDA, the Liberal Reform Party (LRP), and the People's Party (PP). The SDA and LRP each hold four ministerial portfolios, while the PP has three.

First Meeting: The new cabinet held its first formal meeting at the presidential residence, Bessastadir, with President Halla Tomasdottir in attendance.

Cabinet Priorities: Frostadottir outlined priorities of stabilising Iceland's economy by reducing interest rates, enforcing stricter public finance controls, and fostering value creation.

Election Victory: The SDA emerged as the biggest winner in Iceland's parliamentary election held on **November 30**.



Russian President Putin ready to compromise on Ukraine war 21/12/2024

Russian President **Vladimir Putin** is ready to compromise over Ukraine in possible talks with US President-elect **Donald Trump** to end the war.

No Conditions for Talks: Putin has no conditions for talks with Ukrainian authorities and is willing to negotiate with anyone, including Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy.

Legitimate Authorities: Any deal must be signed by Ukraine's legitimate authorities, recognized by the Kremlin as the Ukrainian parliament.

Russia's Position: Putin dismissed claims that Russia is in a weak position and asserted that

the country has grown stronger since the 2022 conflict.

Rejection of Temporary Truce: Putin rejected the idea of a temporary truce with Kyiv, stating that only a lasting peace deal would be acceptable.

Open to Talks with Trump: Putin is open to meeting with Trump but noted that he has not spoken to him for years.

Trump's Promise: Trump has promised to end the conflict swiftly but has not outlined his approach.



Sri Lanka to offer visa-free travel to Indian nationals from Jan 2025 18/12/2024

From January 2025, Indians will be among nationals from **39 countries** eligible for **free visas to travel to Sri Lanka**, as announced by Sri Lankan Foreign Minister **Vijitha Herath** during an interaction organized by the India Foundation in New Delhi. A parliamentary gazette notification will formalize this policy in January. The minister expressed hope that India would reciprocate by offering free visas to Sri Lankan nationals.

Highlighting the strong bilateral ties, he noted that India is the largest source of tourists to Sri Lanka. The announcement came during a three-day state visit (15-17 December) by Sri Lankan President Anura Kumara Dissanayake and his delegation.



German Chancellor Olaf Scholz Loses Vote of Confidence: Understanding Germany's Federal Election System 17/12/2024

On December 16, 2024, German Chancellor Olaf Scholz lost a vote of confidence, triggering a snap election set for February 23, 2025. Germany's new hybrid electoral system combines single-member constituencies with proportional representation, fixing the Bundestag at 630 seats (down from 735). If a party wins more constituency seats than its proportional vote share, some seats will remain vacant, starting with the narrowestmargin victories.

The system retains the 5% national vote threshold for parliamentary entry, with a rule allowing parties to bypass this if they win at least three constituency seats. This mechanism has helped smaller parties like the Left in the past. Current polls predict a highly unpredictable election, with major parties like CDU/CSU leading (34%) but facing competition from the far-right AfD (17%), and smaller parties like the Free Democrats and Left struggling to meet thresholds.

Friedrich Merz of the CDU is a frontrunner to become chancellor, likely needing a coalition due to the fragmented political landscape. The far-right AfD is unlikely to form part of any coalition, as mainstream parties view it as undemocratic.



Britain Joins the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP) 17/12/2024

On December 15, 2024, Britain officially became the first European nation to join the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP), becoming the 12th member of this significant trade bloc. This move marks a major milestone in Britain's post-Brexit trade strategy, aiming to strengthen its global trade links and deepen ties with the Indo-Pacific region.

Key Points

Strategic Expansion: By joining the CPTPP, Britain aims to expand its trade horizons and diversify its economic partnerships.

Economic Benefits: The UK government estimates that the pact could boost the economy by **£2 billion (\$2.5 billion) annually** in the long run.

Trade Opportunities: Membership provides British businesses with lower tariffs and fewer barriers when trading with CPTPP member countries, including Japan, Australia, Canada, Brunei, Chile, Malaysia, New Zealand, Peru, Singapore, and Vietnam.

Influence and Growth: Britain's accession allows it to influence the future development of the CPTPP, including decisions on potential new members like China and Taiwan.



Romania and Bulgaria to join EU's Schengen area on January 1, 2025 13/12/2024

On December 12, 2024, EU interior ministers announced that **Romania and Bulgaria** will fully join the border-free Schengen Area starting January 1, 2025. This decision marks the end of a long journey for both countries, which have been EU members since 2007.

The Schengen Area currently comprises 29 countries, including 25 EU member states and four non-EU countries. Joining the Schengen Area means that Romania and Bulgaria will no longer have border controls with other Schengen countries, allowing for free movement of people, goods, and services.

The decision to allow full membership came after Austria lifted its long-standing veto, which was based on concerns about migration and border management. Both Romania and Bulgaria have made significant progress in addressing these issues, leading to their acceptance into the Schengen Area.



Mohamed al-Bashir appointed as caretaker Prime Minister of Syria 11/12/2024

Mohamed al-Bashir has been appointed as the caretaker Prime Minister of Syria on 10

December 2024. This appointment, effective until March 1, 2025, marks a significant step in Syria's transition. Al-Bashir, a prominent rebel leader and former head of the Hayat Tahrir al-Sham-led Syrian Salvation Government in Idlib, played a crucial role in the recent offensive that led to President Bashar al-Assad's fall.

Born in 1986 in the Jabal Zawiya region of Idlib, al-Bashir holds a degree in electrical and electronic engineering from the University of Aleppo and has studied Sharia and law. He joined the revolutionaries in 2021 and has held various key positions, including the Minister of Development and Humanitarian Affairs.

As caretaker Prime Minister, al-Bashir has pledged to ensure a smooth transition of power and work towards Syria's stability and reconstruction. The international community is closely monitoring the situation, hoping for a peaceful and stable future for the country.



Syrian Rebel Forces Claim Control of Damascus, President Assad Flees 09/12/2024

On December 8, 2024, Syrian rebel forces claimed control of Damascus after a weeklong offensive that faced no resistance from government troops, signaling a dramatic shift in Syria's political landscape. President Bashar al-Assad, who ruled for 24 years, reportedly fled the country to an undisclosed location. Syrian Prime Minister Mohammad Ghazi al-Jalali expressed willingness to ensure a peaceful transition of power to the rebels.

The opposition, led by Hadi al-Bahra, announced plans to collaborate with international partners, including Arab and European countries and the UN, to shape Syria's future. Key developments included the rebels' capture of Homs, the withdrawal of Syrian forces from Damascus International Airport, and the release of prisoners from Saydnaya military prison. Clashes between rebel and regime forces had escalated since November 27, 2024.



India to Chair 68th Session of UN Commission on Narcotic Drugs for the first time 07/12/2024

India has been appointed to chair the 68th Session of the Commission on Narcotic Drugs (CND), with Shambhu Kumaran, India's Permanent Representative to the UN in Vienna, assuming the chairmanship on December 6, 2024. This marks the first time India has chaired this UN body, which is responsible for monitoring global drug trends, supporting balanced policies, and overseeing international drug conventions.

India's leadership reflects its growing global influence and commitment to addressing international challenges through multilateral platforms. As Chair, India will prioritize representing the Global South's interests and fostering dialogue on drug policy issues while continuing the CND's ongoing work.



<u>Netumbo Nandi-Ndaitwah becomes</u> <u>Namibia's first female President</u> 05/12/2024

Netumbo Nandi-Ndaitwah of the ruling SWAPO party has won Namibia's eighth presidential election, becoming the country's first female president with over 57% of the votes. Her closest rival, Panduleni Itula, received 26%.

At 72, Nandi-Ndaitwah, currently vice president, is a seasoned leader in Namibian politics since independence in 1990, with significant domestic and international recognition. SWAPO also secured a majority in the National Assembly, winning 51 out of 96 seats.



World Maritime Technology Conference (WMTC) 2024 from December 4 to 6, 2024, in Chennai 03/12/2024

The World Maritime Technology Conference (WMTC) 2024 will be held from December 4 to 6, 2024, at The Leela Palace, Chennai, India. Organized by the Institute of Marine Engineers (India), Chennai Branch, this prestigious event occurs every three years and

is returning to India after 15 years. It will bring together over **300 delegates** from **21 member organizations across 17 countries**, including participants from the US, UK, Germany, Spain, and Asia-Pacific countries.

If confirmed by the Senate, Patel will become the first Indian-American and South Asian to lead the FBI.

Trump praised Patel's dedication to justice, his efforts to combat crime and trafficking, and his pivotal role in exposing the "Russia Hoax." Patel's nomination highlights the growing influence of the Indian-American community in US politics, following figures like Nikki Haley, who served as Trump's UN Ambassador, and Kamala Harris, the current Vice President

Growth in Cover: The forest and tree cover has increased by 1,445 square kilometers since the 2021 assessment, with 156 square kilometers added to forest cover and 1,289 square kilometers to tree cover.

Technology in Forest Management: The Forest Survey of India (FSI) uses advanced

technology for **real-time fire alerts** and forest fire services to improve forest management.

Assessment Method: The report is published biennially, using satellite data and field-based surveys for a comprehensive assessment of forest and tree resources in India.



India 39th among 119 nations in WEF tourism development index, improves ranking 21/12/2024

India is now ranked **39th among 119 countries** in the Travel and Tourism Development Index (TTDI) 2024 report by the World Economic Forum (WEF).

Improvement in Rank: India's rank improved from **54th in 2021** to 39th in 2024. Due to a revision in the WEF's methodology, India's 2021 rank was adjusted to **38th place**.

India's First Diabetes Biobank Established in Chennai 19/12/2024

First diabetes biobank in Chennai: India has established its first diabetes biobank in Chennai on **December 17, 2024**.

Collaboration: The biobank is a joint effort between the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) and the Madras Diabetes Research Foundation (MDRF).

Purpose: The biobank aims to collect, store, and share biological samples to support advanced scientific research on diabetes.

Research Focus: It will facilitate research into the causes, variations, and complications of diabetes, particularly in the Indian population.

Significance: The biobank is expected to contribute to better prevention, diagnosis, and management strategies for diabetes.



National Testing Agency (NTA) to Focus Exclusively on Entrance Exams for Higher Education Institutions from 2025 18/12/2024

Starting in 2025, the **National Testing Agency** (NTA) will exclusively conduct entrance exams for higher education institutions and will no longer hold recruitment exams, as announced by Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan on December 17, 2024. This decision is part of a broader restructuring effort to improve the NTA's efficiency, credibility, and ability to conduct error-free, technologydriven exams.

The restructuring was guided by a high-level committee led by former ISRO Chairman Dr. K. Radhakrishnan. Formed after the NEET-UG paper leak scandal in June 2024, the committee proposed **101 recommendations** to enhance exam fairness and security, including establishing a **Grievance Reporting and Redressal Cell** (**GRRC**), strengthening cybersecurity, and using dynamic solutions to secure question papers.

Key reforms include conducting entrance exams like JEE and NEET earlier in the academic year (January/February instead of July), simplifying the admission process under CUET, addressing the commercialization of coaching centers, and focusing on students' mental health and timely result declarations. The NTA will also leverage public testing infrastructure and integrate psychometric research for continuous improvement. The committee's recommendations come after incidents like the NEET paper leak, which prompted a CBI investigation and widespread criticism of the examination system. To oversee the reforms, Dr. Radhakrishnan will lead a high-power steering committee. These changes aim to create a robust, studentfriendly, and secure exam process.



Nepal's Chief of the Army Staff (CoAS), General Ashok Raj Sigdel honored with the rank of Honorary General of the Indian Army 17/12/2024

Nepal's Chief of the Army Staff (CoAS), General Ashok Raj Sigdel was honored with the rank of *Honorary General of the Indian Army* by India's President, Droupadi Murmu, on December 16, 2024.

General Sigdel served as the Reviewing Officer at the Indian Military Academy's passing out parade in Dehradun, where Nepali Army Officer Cadet Prabin Pandey was awarded the *"Best Foreign Officer Cadet Award"*. Addressing the newly commissioned officers, General Sigdel encouraged them to uphold the Army's values and be exemplary leaders. He also laid a wreath at the IMA War Memorial in honor of fallen soldiers.



The vehicles will feature **AI-enabled dashboard cameras** and **closed cabinets** for efficient emergency response. They are equipped with advanced communication and safety tools to minimize traffic disruptions, enhance road safety, and improve the overall experience for highway users.

Creation of Bangladesh: The war resulted in the birth of a new nation, Bangladesh, bringing freedom to millions of people.



Indian Light Tank (ILT) Successfully Fires at High Altitude 14/12/2024

The Indian Light Tank (ILT) has achieved a significant milestone by successfully firing rounds at various ranges at an altitude exceeding 4,200 meters. The Defence Ministry stated that the ILT, a 25-ton class armoured fighting vehicle, is designed for high-altitude operations to meet the Armed Forces' needs. It has been developed by the Combat Vehicles Research Development Establishment, a DRDO lab in Chennai, based on the Indian Army's provisional requirements.

The ILT's airlift capability was also demonstrated by the Indian Air Force, enabling its rapid deployment in remote and challenging areas inaccessible by road or rail. Following these internal performance trials, the ILT will undergo further evaluations before being presented for user trials.



Defence Ministry Signs ₹13,500 Crore Deal with HAL for 12 Su-30MKI Fighter Aircraft 14/12/2024

On December 12, 2024, the **Defence Ministry** signed a contract worth **₹13,500 crore** with **Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL)** for the procurement of **12 Su-30MKI aircraft**. This deal is a significant boost to India's defense capabilities and supports the **'Aatmanirbhar Bharat'** initiative, with **62.6% of the aircraft's components** being domestically produced.

The aircraft will be manufactured at HAL's Nashik division, enhancing the operational capability of the Indian Air Force and strengthening the country's defense preparedness. This contract is expected to stimulate the Indian economy by creating job opportunities and promoting technological advancements in the defense sector.

About Su-30MKI aircraft

The **Su-30MKI** (Sukhoi-30MKI) is a **multirole combat fighter aircraft** jointly developed by Russia's Sukhoi Design Bureau and India's **Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL)** for the Indian Air Force (IAF). It is a variant of the Sukhoi Su-30, tailored to meet the specific requirements of the IAF.

The event also includes the **Demtech India 2024** as a collocated show, offering specialized insights and opportunities in demolition technology. The NASSCOM Pavilion will display advancements in construction technology and digital transformation, along with a dedicated Finance Zone to facilitate networking with key financial institutions and investors.

The expo is expected to draw around 75,000 visitors, further reinforcing its status as a premier destination for progress and collaboration in the construction industry.



Revised Structure of CUET-UG Examination (2025) 11/12/2024

From 2025, students will be allowed to appear for any subject in the **Common University Entrance Test-UG (CUET-UG)**, regardless of their Class 12 subjects. The exam will only be conducted in **Computer-Based Test (CBT)** mode and will expand to cover **63 subjects** (up from 37). Students can choose a maximum of **five subjects**, instead of six as earlier.

Key changes:

Uniform duration: All exams will last 60 minutes.

No optional questions: All questions will now be compulsory.

Streamlined admissions: CUET promotes transparency and reduces dependence on varying cut-offs, making the process more technology-driven.

Introduced in 2022, CUET has evolved to eliminate rigid disciplinary boundaries in higher education, ensuring a fair and standardized admissions process.



Trial Flights Begin at Noida International Airport, Commercial Launch in April 2025 10/12/2024

The Noida International Airport in Greater Noida marked a significant milestone on **9 December 2024** as its first trial flight landed, receiving a ceremonial water cannon salute. The flight, carrying AAI officials and technical experts, conducted a 15-minute trial before landing on the completed **3,900-metre runway** and later took off after a brief stop. The data collected during this trial will be

analyzed by the DGCA, with trials continuing until **15 December**.

The airport, operated by **Zurich International Airport AG**, is 85% complete, with the **terminal building** and equipment installation nearing finalization. The **Air Traffic Control (ATC) Tower** is fully operational, and advanced landing systems (CAT-1 and CAT-3 ILS) have been successfully tested.

The first commercial flight is scheduled for **April 2025**, with the airport expected to handle **65 daily flights** (62 domestic, 2 international, and 1 cargo), serving **12 million passengers annually**. Upon full completion, it will be the **fourth largest airport in Asia**, with a 40-year management contract by Zurich International Airport AG.



INS Tushil, a multi role stealth guided missile frigate commissioned into Indian Navy in Russia 10/12/2024

On December 9, 2024, **INS Tushil**, a multi-role stealth guided missile frigate, was commissioned into the Indian Navy in Russia in the presence of Defence Minister **Rajnath Singh**. The commissioning was hailed as a symbol of India's growing maritime strength and the deep friendship between India and Russia.

The ship, incorporating increasing **Made-in-India** content, represents a collaborative effort between Indian and Russian industries.

The event was also attended by Chief of Naval Staff Admiral **Dinesh K Tripathi**, Russian Deputy Minister of Defence Alexander Vasilyevich Fomin, Governor of Kaliningrad Alexey Sergeyevich Besprozvannykh and other senior officials from the Indian and Russian Governments, Navies, and industries.



Oxford's Saïd Business School and the Gates Foundation have recognized India's PRAGATI platform 03/12/2024

A recent study by **Oxford's Saïd Business** School and the Gates Foundation has recognized the effectiveness of India's **PRAGATI (Pro-Active Governance and** Timely Implementation) platform. Launched in 2015 by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, PRAGATI has significantly transformed the delivery of infrastructure projects in India.

The study, titled **"From Gridlock to Growth: How Leadership Enables India's PRAGATI Ecosystem to Power Progress,"** highlights how PRAGATI has driven accountability, facilitated federal and regional collaboration, and accelerated the completion of long-delayed projects worth **\$205 billion**. The platform features a digital dashboard for real-time project monitoring and supports videoconference review meetings chaired by PM Modi.

The 4th edition of the India-Malaysia Joint Military Exercise *Harimau Shakti* began on **2 December 2024** at Bentong Camp, Malaysia. The exercise features 78 personnel from the Indian Army's Mahar Regiment and 123 personnel from Malaysia's Royal Malaysian Regiment. Running until **15 December**, the exercise focuses on enhancing joint military capabilities, particularly in counter-insurgency operations in jungle terrain. It aims to facilitate the exchange of best practices in tactics, techniques, and procedures for conducting joint operations.

<u>'One Nation, One Election' bills refers to</u> Joint Parliamentary Committee for wider consultations 18/12/2024

On December 17, 2024, the government referred the One Nation One Election (ONOE) bills to a Joint Parliamentary **Committee (JPC)** for wider consultations. Union Home Minister Amit Shah announced in the Lok Sabha that Prime Minister Narendra Modi recommended detailed discussions at every level before proceeding with the bills. This followed the introduction of the Constitution (One Hundred and Twenty-Ninth Amendment) Bill, 2024, and the Union Territories Law (Amendment) Bill, 2024 by Union Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal, which aim to enable simultaneous elections for the Lok Sabha and State Assemblies. Opposition leaders objected to the bills, but Meghwal described the opposition as political and reiterated the government's readiness to involve the JPC.

The **JPC** is a temporary parliamentary committee comprising members from both Houses and political parties. It examines specific bills or issues in detail, gathers evidence from experts, and consults stakeholders. Its recommendations are advisory, and the government is not obligated to implement them. The JPC is dissolved after completing its examination.



Union Cabinet Approves 'One Nation, One Election' Bills 13/12/2024

On December 12, 2024, the Union Cabinet approved the **'One Nation, One Election' Bills**, a significant step towards implementing simultaneous elections across India. This initiative aims to synchronize the elections for the Lok Sabha, state assemblies, and local bodies, reducing the frequency of elections and the associated costs and disruptions.

The concept of **'One Nation, One Election'** has been a long-standing agenda of the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). The proposal received a major push with the recommendations of a high-level committee led by former President Ram Nath Kovind. The committee suggested amendments to the Constitution to facilitate simultaneous elections in two phases: first, aligning the Lok Sabha and state assembly elections, followed by synchronizing municipal and panchayat elections within 100 days of the national and state polls.

The approved bills include a constitutional amendment to enable simultaneous elections and another bill to amend provisions in laws dealing with Union Territories that have legislative assemblies, such as Delhi, Puducherry, and Jammu & Kashmir. The government plans to introduce these bills in the ongoing Winter Session of Parliament, with the expectation of referring them to a parliamentary committee for further scrutiny and consultations. Supporters of the 'One Nation, One Election' initiative argue that it will enhance governance efficiency, reduce election-related expenditures, and minimize the disruption caused by frequent imposition of the Model Code of Conduct. However, the proposal has faced criticism from opposition parties, who claim it threatens regional representation and federalism.



Devendra Fadnavis becomes Maharashtra Chief Minister for the Third Time 05/12/2024

Devendra Fadnavis becomes the Chief Minister of Maharashtra for the third time on 5 December 2024. He leads the BJP-led Mahayuti alliance to a landslide victory in the recent assembly elections.

There are two deputy chief ministers: Ajit Pawar of the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) and Eknath Shinde of the Shiv Sena. The swearing-in ceremony to be attended by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and several other prominent leaders.

Fadnavis, who has previously served as Chief Minister from 2014 to 2019 and briefly in 2019, was unanimously chosen as the Leader of the BJP Legislative Party.

In the recent Assembly Election Mahayuti alliance secured 235 seats in the 288-member House. The BJP emerged as the single-largest party with 132 seats, followed by Shiv Sena with 57 and NCP with 41 seats.

PSLV-C60: India's Leap Forward in Space Docking Technology with SpaDeX 31/12/2024

The PSLV-C60 mission was launched on December 30, 2024, from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh.

Mission Objective: The primary objective of the mission is to demonstrate in-space docking technology using two small spacecraft, SDX01 (Chaser) and SDX02 (Target), in a low-Earth circular orbit.

SpaDeX (Space Docking Experiment): SpaDeX is a cost-effective technology demonstrator mission aimed at developing and demonstrating the technology needed for rendezvous, docking, and undocking of two small spacecraft.

Significance: This mission is historic as it aims to make India the fourth country globally to master space docking technology. This capability is crucial for future missions like Chandrayaan-4, the Indian space station, and the manned Gaganyaan mission.

Payloads: The PSLV-C60 carried 24 experimental payloads contributed by academia and startups. These payloads include high-resolution imaging, multi-spectral imaging for vegetation studies, and radiation monitoring.

Technological Milestones: The mission incorporates several cutting-edge

technologies such as a compact docking mechanism, laser range finders, power transfer technology, and inter-satellite communication systems.

Future Operations: Docking operations are set to begin, with the final docking expected by January 7, 2025. Post-docking, electrical power transfer will be tested before the satellites operate their individual payloads for up to two years.



Smart India Hackathon 2024: A Platform for Technological Innovation 14/12/2024

The Smart India Hackathon 2024 concluded successfully with multiple teams from across India emerging as winners across various categories. The event was held at multiple nodal centres, including the National Institute of Technology (NIT) Srinagar, G. H. Raisoni College of Engineering, Nagpur, and IIT Jammu, among others.

Key Highlights:

Winners in Mumbai: Teams such as Team Terabyte (Girijananda Chaudhary University Guwahati), Team Shiledar (Datta Meghe College of Engineering Navi Mumbai), and others were recognized for their solutions in problem statements like 'Conversational Image Recognition Chatbot', 'Women Safety Analytics', and 'AI-based solution for traffic management'.

Participation: A total of **34 teams consisting of 204 students** participated at Welingkar Institute in Mumbai, working on problem statements provided by various ministries,

including the Ministry of Home Affairs and the Department of Science and Technology.

NIT Srinagar: Hosted the Grand Finale for the first time, with six teams emerging as top performers from the 51 nodal centers across the country.




ISRO launches PSLV C-59 carrying ESA's PROBA-3 from Sriharikota 06/12/2024

On **5 December 2024**, ISRO successfully launched the **PSLV C-59** rocket from the **Satish Dhawan Space Centre, Sriharikota**, at **16:04 IST**, carrying the **PROBA-3 spacecraft** into a highly elliptical orbit. The mission, a collaboration with the European Space Agency (ESA), is managed by **NewSpace India Limited (NSIL)**, ISRO's commercial arm.

The **PROBA-3 mission**, an **in-orbit demonstration**, involves two satellites launched in a stacked configuration to showcase advanced technologies such as **precise satellite positioning**, formation flying, and proximity operations. These satellites, weighing a combined **545 kg**, were placed in orbit 18 minutes after launch and will fly in close formation to study the Sun's **corona** (outer atmosphere).

This launch underscores ISRO's expertise in commercial satellite missions, with PSLV C-59 marking the second ESA satellite launch using an Indian rocket. **States**
